Forms and Fees

Fees are due paid in full 10 days before any camp session begins. If registration occurs within 10 days prior to the start of the session, all fees are due with registration.

Please complete the Physician Signature Form that is attached to your confirmation email and upload it to the Campbrain Camper Paperwork Center. Note that this form is required for youth participation in camp.

Camper Store Accounts:

All campers have a camp store account. We are in the process of updating our camp store system and will send out notification emails and post to our CampBrain with instructions!

Opening Day Schedule

Check-in begins at 3:00: Campers and parents will be greeted by our staff on the Clearwater Forest driveway as they enter and given information about cabin assignments, unloading, parking and other information. The Opening Worship begins at 4:00 p.m. Sadly, parents are not invited to the Opening Worship this year. Please note that our staff are not ready to receive campers prior to 3:00 p.m.

Closing Day Schedule

Our Closing Program will run from approximately **8:45 am until 9:30 am**. Parents are not allowed to attend this year. Parents are asking to line up vehicles down toward the lake and along the road to receive their campers and chat with the counselors.

If your child needs to leave at a time other than 9:30am on Saturday, please contact the office so proper arrangements can be made.

Behavior Issues and Concerns: While a wide range of behavior is to be anticipated, not all behavior is acceptable. Clearwater Forest does not allow campers to stay at camp who purposefully, or consistently, negatively affect others experiences. Here is a list of behaviors that are not acceptable and may result in disciplinary consequences, parent contact, and even expulsion from camp:

- Violent behavior of any kind causing harm to other campers, staff, the natural environment, or camp property;
- Use of threats or intimidation;
- Consistent use of profanity;
- Sexual harassment;
- Use/possession of tobacco products, alcohol, illegal drugs, firearms, knives or other weapons, fireworks, or pornography;*
- Consistent disrespect of camp staff and rules.

At Clearwater Forest, bullying is inexcusable, and we have a firm policy against all types of bullying. Our camp philosophy is based on our mission statement which ensures that every camper has the opportunity to engage in a positive faith-building community, build meaningful relationships and acquire valuable life skills. We work together as a team to ensure that campers gain self-confidence, make new friends, and go home with great memories.

What to Bring:

Good, But Not Essential
